

Eastern Kentucky University's guide "Preparing Our Students for an Al-Enhanced Workplace"

EDUCATION SHAPES TOMORROW'S JOBS

A recent report from Georgetown University sheds light on job trends, illustrating future projections for the education required to secure "sustainable" positions—those that offer salaries around \$50,000.

This information emphasizes the necessity of investing in students by providing resources similar to those available at JCTC, ensuring they have access to education and training that align with expanding sectors such as STEM and healthcare. Additionally, investing in infrastructure for middle-skill jobs is vital for achieving future success.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE OF KENTUCKIANA

In the class of 2022, over 4,000 seniors did not enroll in college, but 76% were employed within a year, earning a median income of just over \$18,300.
